The first is that in on January 16-18 the Special Olympics- Georgia Winter games were at various schools and gyms in Cobb County. What a great start to the New Year! Already we have exemplified nearly 200 Third Degree members in 2009—Congratulations to all these new leaders of the Order!

Knights of Columbus presence at the March for Life in Atlanta on January 22 was noted and appreciated. We provided an Honor Guard for the Archbishop at the Mass and Rally, and were everywhere in the March. The front page of the Georgia Bulletin showed the marchers, and prominently displayed were our blue and white “Defend Life” signs. Brother David Canale and several other Brother Knights distributed 350 of these signs. We really walked the walk that day! Next year—1000 signs! And the Knights and

families to carry them!

We are receiving our first shipment of wheelchairs. If you can make it, I'd like to see you at the VA Hospital in Augusta on March 14th when we distribute these first chairs. The ceremony takes place at 9:30 am.

We have ordered our first ultrasound machine, as well. This will be placed at the Women's Enrichment Center in Dalton. As you recall, we are placing these machines to help women decide to keep their unborn babies. Studies show that when a woman goes to a crisis pregnancy center and is shown the life she carries inside, 75% decide not to have an abortion. The fundraising for this cause will continue, and the next machine will be placed in the Diocese of Savannah.

Finally, I encourage every one of you leaders to take care of our troops. Our Brother Knights are our troops in our mission of Charity, Unity, Fraternity, and Patriotism. When you welcome a new Knight at his First Degree, don't let him go off on his own. Keep in touch with him. Reach out to him and his family. When we train soldiers for the Armed Forces, we don't let them graduate from Basic and then say “you're on your own!” We continue to train and care for them and make sure they are involved in the unit. Be he a private or a general,

The “Skinny” on the Upcoming State Convention

The 107th Annual Meeting of the Georgia State Council will be held at Jekyll Island on May 16th and 17th. In order for the delegates from your council to be seated at the convention, and be paid their mileage and per diem, two things must be completed:

1. Per capita taxes and other outstanding debts to the State Council and Supreme must be paid. The State Per Capita Billings were sent to all Financial Secretaries on January 2. Per Capita billing procedures are specified in the State Council By-Laws. Specifically, the billing is based upon the councils total membership minus the number of Honorary Life and Disabled Members as listed at Supreme on January 1. Pending suspensions, or other actions are not considered. Per capita payments are due to the State Secretary by April 15.
2. The delegate certification form must be completed, signed and impressed with the council seal and sent to the State Secretary by April 15. Be sure to designate your Grand Knight even if he cannot attend. Then provide the names of the other delegate and two alternates. Also provide each delegate with an impressed copy to carry with them, in case the form gets lost in the mail. (Note if you have to change delegates or alternates, you can complete a new form with a later date.) If delegates arrive but are not on the delegate form, they will not be able to vote nor will they receive the mileage and per diem check.

Matter of Concern for Every Council

BY LAWS:

I have stated at our Grand Knights' meetings that each council should provide a copy of their bylaws to the State Advocate. With your help, the number of outstanding by laws has been reduced. However, there are still 18 councils that have not complied.

If your council does not have their bylaws, they can go to KOFC.ORG (the Supreme web site not the state web site) under officers on line and follow the instructions. The Grand Knight of the council is the only person who has access to the bylaws section. This is one of the reasons that a council should provide their report of officers to Supreme at the beginning of each fraternal year. If your council by laws conform to the boiler plate i.e. amount of dues, meeting dates and time, initiation fee; prompt approval from Supreme is assured. The cost for 100 copies is \$25.00 or 200 copies for \$30.00. The HELP LINE is 1-800-380-9995 for any special problem that you may have.

At our Grand Knights meetings, several councils stated that they provided new members with a copy of their council by-laws. I think this is a good practice that should be part of every council's first degree program. Good communication is key to the retention of our brother knights.

SUSPENSION FOR NO-PAYMENT OF DUES:

The financial secretary handbook (page D 7) states "A member must be in arrears at least four months before he can be suspended for non-payment." The Knights of Columbus Charter Constitution Laws Section 168 # 3 Failure to pay dues states "Who shall fail to pay his dues to his council within three months after the same are levied and payable (other than assessments levied by the Supreme Council, Board of Directors or for death benefit assessments or contributions)" is subject to Summary Suspension.

This does not mean that a council can only bill a member for one quarter of dues. Most councils operate under a annual dues billing period which is satisfactory. A council can establish any dues billing period that works for them and call bill a member for any arrears monies. However, if a member in arrears pays dues for the current quarter, that member cannot be suspended for non-payment of dues.

Jedlicka Named General Agent



The Knights of Columbus Agency Department selected John Jedlicka as the Jurisdiction of Georgia's General Agent in charge of the Order's insurance program in the state. The appointment is effective March 1 when the name of the agency charges to the Jedlicka Agency.

He is responsible for the Agency's entire Field Agent force and reports to the Order's senior officers at Supreme headquarters in New Haven.

He replaced Douglas Gotsch, the state's first and only general agent. Gotsch retired after 35 years' of service to his Brother Knights in Georgia.

"I recognize the ground-breaking efforts of my predecessor and good friend, Doug Gotsch. I further ask the thousands of Brother Knights who know Doug to join me in prayers and good wishes for his well-deserved retirement," Jedlicka said.

Jedlicka joined the Gotsch Agency in 2004 and was the Agency's top agent and was among the top 50 agents Order-wide.

His first responsibility as the new general agent is to bring the Agency to full staffing levels statewide and to ensure that the almost 14,000 Brother Knights in the state have access to the Order's, first-class insurance program.

He and his wife, Eileen, have lived in Dunwoody since 1979 after moving to the Atlanta area from New York City. They have three children, two (almost) grandchildren and no pets.

He is a Fourth Degree Knight and a Past Grand Knight of Council 6517 in Sandy Springs.

Exciting Challenges Lie Ahead

We have some exciting challenges facing us in 2009. There were a total of 75 nominations submitted for consideration for a Service Program award in 2008. The breakdowns for nominations in each service category are as follows:

- Church – 21 nominations;
- Community – 19 nominations;
- Council – 16 nominations;
- Family – 10 nominations;
- Youth – 9 nominations.

The winners of last year's competition were selected by a committee appointed by the State Deputy. A total of 27 councils submitted nominations which equates to only 29%.

Archbishop Donnellan council 7923 from Lilburn took 1st in the State for Church programs & went on to win 4th place in the order for their work to provide "Financial Planning for Priests".

Fr. O'Reilly council 4358 from Decatur took 1st in the State for their Youth program & went on to win 5th place in the order for their "Keep Christ in Christmas Poster contest".

Congratulations to both of these councils as well as all of the other State winners.

Many of you have asked for the criteria for judging the competition. I can only tell you that the only requirements are clearly stated in the instructions given in the Surge with Service booklet. I can also tell you that Councils 4358 or 7923 would not have won international awards if they had done the minimum required in the Surge with Service. Here are only SOME of the things the selection committee used in their judging process:

- Completeness: Were all of the Order requirements met?
- Presentation: How did the submission look?
- Clarity: Was the submission clear (and complete) as to what they were trying to do & was it submitted in the correct category.
- Supporting Information: Pictures, Parish bulletins, local publications, Order publications, etc.

In conclusion, don't under value your work in your councils. We must NEVER lose sight of why we are providing these programs. Identify a need & fill that need. If we remember the words of our Worthy State Deputy "The Good Works of the Order are accomplished at the Council Level" we will never be a loser. Show the State & the Order that Georgia is up front in Charity, Fraternity, Unity and Patriotism.

You are Never Too Old To Serve!

That is the motto of **All Saints Knights of Columbus Council 11402**. This Council does something unique in all of the Knights of Columbus worldwide. Some years ago Pine Crest Academy, which had been located at All Saints Catholic Church in Dunwoody, relocated to Forsythe County to the North. This left All Saints without a source of Altar servers for Funeral Masses during the week.

With a funeral soon to be held, Msgr. R, Donald Kiernan asked Dave Moeller, a member of the Knights Council if the Knights could supply some servers. Since the Knights stand behind our Priests, of course the answer was yes! Thus was born the Knights of Columbus Acolyte Teams. Currently we have 61 Acolytes, who serve at a Funeral about once a month. We are split into 5 teams with a captain of each. One team is being used strictly for Saturday Funerals, as these are men who work during the week. Although we are assigned to teams, at least most of us are, we can be called to fill in at any time. The teams have 8 men each, with the other Acolytes being Alternates to be called in an emergency. An actual funeral Team will consist of 5 men, Cross Bearer, 2 Candle Bearers, and 2 actual servers. We all wear Black shoes, Grey slacks, White shirt with a Knights of Columbus tie, and Navy Jacket. At Funerals it is not uncommon for both Family members of the deceased and guests alike to compliment us on how professional we look! Msgr. Kiernan likes us so well that he usually asks us to serve even if he is doing a Funeral at another Church. This is truly a service to our Priests and to our Church, and we are all proud to do it.

Finally, the **Knights of Columbus Day of the Unborn Child** is celebrated every year on March 25th, the Feast of the Annunciation. Please plan a project for your council on this day. DISTRICT 5 - (DD Walter Cowan)

- ... **Father Peter Whelan Assembly** donated \$4000.00 to the Veterans Hospital, Dublin, GA. The Assembly also donated \$500.00 to CCG for the Ultrasound Machine program.
- ... **Council 3607** First and Second Degree teams conducted 2 - First Degrees and 1 - Second Degree at Fort Benning developing a new council. Institution of this new council is anticipated by the end of February. We currently have 19 new members and 6 transfers for a total of 25 of the 30 needed for institution.
- ... **Council 1019, Columbus**, is making excellent progress toward certification of a First Degree team. We should have their team operational in a few weeks.

Knights distributed bottles to parishioners who took them home and filled them with donations, then returned the bottles to the Church.

DISTRICT 17 (Ron Kozak)

... **Council 7662 St. Joseph in Dalton.** PGK Paul Zock has been instrumental in obtaining the **first sonogram machine** in Georgia under State Deputy Dan Baker's program. It will be installed at the Women's Enrichment Center in Dalton, Ga. Great work Paul ! Also the Council has just completed a project installing flag poles for both the American and Papal flags at the Church.

... **Council 9923 St. Catherine in Kennesaw.** The Council recently completed the hanging of a new **Crucifix in the Sanctuary** at St. Catherines. This Crucifix was hand carved in Italy and reportedly weighs about 250 lbs. If you are in the Kennesaw area this is a must see.

DISTRICT 18 (Gene Brannon)

... Fraternal Survey results from the district indicated that a total of **\$99,670 and 24,999 volunteer hours were donated** to church, community and youth charitable activities with 53% of the money going to youth programs. Add to that the number of visits to our sick and bereaved brothers and their families it is obvious to see why, as one brother Knight put it, "...this type of unheralded service is exactly why I am proud to be a Knight."

... A dinner was sponsored by **Fr. Grady Council 4410** and approximately 60 Knights and their families were invited to create a table decoration with the **"Keep Christ in Christmas"** theme. Knights, some in regalia, marched in the annual Rome Christmas Parade. The crowd applauded when the Knights marched by with their "Keep Christ in Christmas" banner. The council also provided all the wrapping paper and ribbon, as well as contributed to gifts and meals, for the five neediest families of the parish.

... **Msgr. Regan Council 8731** conducted a Council Free Throw Contest and sponsored a blood drive. As a follow-up to the care packages sent to parish family GI's overseas the council sent Christmas cards with McDonald's certificates to those stationed in the States. At the February meeting the Chaplain conducted a "blessing of the throats" in honor of the Feast Day of St. Blaise.

... A council Free Throw Contest was held by **Sweetwater Council 10821** and they held a spaghetti dinner fundraiser for the State Ultrasound Project netting over \$425 for the project. Another spaghetti dinner raised \$500 that was presented to the USO. The council also teamed up with Mother Teresa Assembly 2562 to serve meals to approximately 1,400 members of the Armed Forces at the Atlanta Airport USO.

... **Fr. Mulvin Council 12287** continues their successful food drive efforts. Near Christmas, when members of St. Vincent de Paul told the council their pantry was full after their previous drive, a drive was held and the food donated to Grace Baptist Church, another organization in the community to provide help to those in need. Recently one more drive, for St. Vincent de Paul was conducted. Two recent drives collected approximately 1,800 pounds of food.

... **St. John Vianney Council 12580** hosted a New Year's Eve dance and over \$100 was donated to the parish general fund. The Pro-Life spaghetti dinner raised almost \$250 for the State Ultrasound Project. The council also donated funds to help defray the cost of Rosary CDs distributed free to parishioners. The council also held a Free Throw Contest in January.


